WHAT IS LOVE?



Why Is Love So Important in Christianity?

Love is important to Christianity because love defines it. God is love, and Christ Jesus' sacrifice on the cross was the greatest expression of that love. We are commanded to love others as we have been loved, specifically to forgive as we have been forgiven out of the Father's great love for us. Far beyond a feeling, biblical love defines who and Whose we are. The source of Christian love is Christ, Himself. Love that dwells in us, because of the Holy Spirit living in us. Love isn't just important to Christianity. Love is Christianity. To love is to follow Christ.

The book of <u>Psalms</u> expresses worship. Throughout its many pages, Psalms encourages its readers to praise God for who He is and what He has done. The Psalms illuminate the greatness of our God, affirm His faithfulness to us in times of trouble, and remind us of the absolute centrality of His Word.

Then he said to them, "These are my words which I spoke to you, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled."

Psalms that teach us about love: <u>Psalm 51</u>—Love Forgives; <u>Psalm 139</u>—Love Is Compassionate; <u>Psalm 18</u>—Love is Powerful; <u>Psalm 71</u>—Love Gives Us Hope; <u>Psalm 100</u>—Love is Steadfast; <u>Psalm 22</u>— Love Teaches Trust; <u>Psalm 86</u>— Love Is Patient

The <u>Gospel of John</u> depicts love as a multifaceted, self-sacrificial, and active force in Christian community. It emphasizes the idea of a personal relationship with God, and the notion that God can become personal and dwell within the individual believer.

The Song of Songs is often interpreted as a devotional allegory in praise of the love of God and his people. Alternatively, it may be seen as a parable which, by celebrating human love, points beyond itself to the love of God.

The Work of Christmas

December is often an emotionally demanding time -- so many things to do, traditions we feel obligated to uphold, griefs that powerfully grasp us. It also is a time we hope to prioritize the most important things of life, which is why we try to share time with people dear to us. During this recent Christmas season, I hope that you experienced moments of great joy, deep peace, blessed assurance, and glimpses of Emmanuel, God with us.

Our invitation as disciples of Jesus is to recognize and share these important things throughout the year. Like all deep truths of faith, Christmas is meant to change who we are and what we do. Deep down, I think many know this, which is why I often see people quote and share a poem written by theologian Howard Thurman about 50 years ago, "<u>The Work of Christmas.</u>" Thurman's poem features words lad-en with meaning for Christians: find, heal, feed, release, peace, heart. I trust that you will continue to find old and new ways to bless others.

In a time such as this, I believe we may also be called upon to testify to the reality of these important things celebrated at Christmas each year. Our society is incredibly divided right now. There is widespread mistrust and deep angst in large numbers of people across the spectra of political party identification and theological beliefs. Such things manifest in so many ways: anger, cynicism, doubt, despair, fear. So much of this is the exact opposite of Christmas. Such division and discontent can easily limit the faithful work Thurman identifies.

In this year, as much as we are feeding and healing, as much as we are accompanying and making peace, may we remind ourselves of the reality of Christmas. May we recognize and live the truth of God's incar-nation - the person of Jesus living and being among us, and the spirit of God moving around us, and some-times even through us - always. And may we remind others, sometimes explicitly, of this reality - and the important and good things of God that Christmas highlights. In the days ahead, we and our neighbors may need this explicit encouragement. May it be part of our ongoing, life-changing, Work of Christmas.
