Memorial Day is a significant American holiday dedicated to honoring and remembering those who have died while serving in the U.S. military. It's a day of reflection and mourning, not a celebration, and it is observed on the last Monday of May.

# What is the difference between Memorial Day and Veterans Day?

- Memorial Day honors the sacrifice and loss of those who served and died in the military.
- Veterans Day honors all who have served or are currently serving in the U.S. military.

Use this day to show how grateful we are for their bravery, and as a promise that we'll always remember their courage and sacrifice.

After the Civil War, Americans across the nation began holding tributes in the Spring, decorating graves with flowers, reciting prayers, and honoring the estimated 620,000 fallen soldiers of the war (2% of the population at the time). Some records show that formerly enslaved people in Charleston, South Carolina organized the earliest Memorial Day commemorations in 1865. In 1866, the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day when the city closed all businesses so residents could decorate the gravesites of soldiers with flowers and American flags every year.



# When You Want a Guarantee: 10 Promises of God for Moms

# 1. He will be with you:

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."
- Psalm 145: 18-19 "The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth. He fulfills the desires of those who fear him; he hears their cry and saves them."

# 2. He will guide you:

- Proverbs 3:56 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths."
- Psalm 32:8 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you."

# 3. He is always working:

- John 13:7 "Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."
- Philippians 2:13 "...for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure."

# 4. He will accomplish his purposes:

- Psalm 138:8 "The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me; your steadfast love, O Lord, endures forever. Do not forsake the work of your hands."
- Psalm 57:2 "I will cry unto God most high; unto God that performeth all things for me."

# 5. He will provide all that you need:

- Philippians 4:19 "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus."
- 2 Corinthians 9:8 "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work."

# 6. He is always faithful:

- Psalm 25:8-10 "Good and upright is the Lord; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way. All the paths of the Lord are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his testimonies."
- Lamentations 3:22-23 "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

# 7. He gives us grace in time of need:

- 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness"
- 1 Corinthians 10:13 "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it"

# 8. He gives grace to the humble:

- 1 Peter 5:-5,6 "Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble." Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time."
- James 4:6-10 "But He gives more grace. Therefore He says: God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble." Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you.

- Jeremiah 24:7: "I will give them a heart to know Me, That I am Yahweh. They will be My people and I will be their God because they will return to Me with all their heart."
- Ezekiel 36:26 "And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh."


