## **Lighting of the Advent Candles**

The birth of Jesus has been told and retold a thousand times and in a thousand ways. Its impact cannot be contained in any one perspective. The element of the story we focus on changes how we hear it, how we imagine it, and how we experience it. There are new parents excited to meet their son. A king terrified he might lose power and influence. Shepherds in awe of all they have seen and heard. We hope when we believe something good is on the horizon. We hope when we recognize all is not yet as it should be. Our world is not what it should be, but with Jesus we have hope that one day it will be. We light the candle of hope because hope creates a path for a new, unknown story to unfold.

Hope allows us to set down, even temporarily, our anxiety and worry for much-needed peace. Peace allows for a respite, bringing much-needed restoration. And restoration is needed to act without becoming numb or burned out. We light the candle of peace because peace requires us to pay attention to the needs of those around us.

When we are at peace, we can see joy in the most unexpected of places. Mary and Joseph found joy in a warm and dry manger. We can find joy in small acts of kindness and beauty in a harsh world. We light the candle of joy because joy sustains us in the midst of uncertainty.

From joy we move on to love. Love for God, love for family, for our neighbors, and for this world. Love motivates us to protect others and this world for generations to come. Love is far more than an emotion; it is the foundation of the gospel that is good for all. We light the candle of love because love makes the impossible possible.

Tonight we light the Christ candle. May we acknowledge the new light it provides, breaking through the darkness, disrupting what is, lighting the path for our dreams to come. Give us the will to dream, O God. May all be true in your name.
